

BOIL WATER ADVISORY

Waterline repair for Thursday, July 13th, 2017

There is a leak coming from a hydrant's valve box. Lee's Trenching will be repairing the hydrant. Due to depressurization in the Jamestown Township water supply, bacterial contamination may occur in the water system.

When is this happening?

From **8:00 am Thursday, July 13 until approximately 5 pm that same day**, the water will be turned off for repair work. After the line has been repaired, Jamestown water staff will turn the water back on in order to start flushing the line, followed by taking water samples to be tested for any bacteriological contamination. Once the test has cleared, we will lift the boil water advisory.

The sample will be collected to determine that the water quality meets the state drinking water standards. We will inform you as soon as possible when tests show no bacterial contamination and you no longer need to boil your water. We anticipate finished lab results by **5 pm Saturday, July 15.**

What should I do?

DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a boil, let it boil for one minute, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and preparing food. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water. Continue using boiled or bottled water until further notice.

This boil water notice shall remain in effect until results from the sampling verify the water is safe to drink. **Customers will be notified when the boil water advisory has been lifted via door notice.**
