

PUBLIC NOTICE

SPRINKLING BAN FOR WYOMING WATER SYSTEM

Effective at 6:00 a.m. Tuesday, August 11, 2020 the City of Wyoming has declared a **Level Three** Water Emergency. It is therefore necessary to impose a total sprinkling ban within the City of Wyoming and within all communities served by the City of Wyoming Water System. The communities affected include the Ottawa County communities of Park, Holland, Zeeland, Olive, Blendon, **Jamestown**, and Georgetown (Jenison) Townships, and the City of Hudsonville. The Kent County communities affected are the City of Grandville, City of Kentwood, Byron-Gaines Township, and the City of Wyoming.

The City water facilities are pumping at maximum rates. Due to necessary watermain repairs, we are unable to maintain an adequate level of water in our storage tanks. Low pressure and low volumes of water are a distinct possibility unless users comply with the sprinkling restriction and voluntarily conserve.

Due to this extreme emergency, the City of Wyoming will be issuing municipal civil infractions to any violators of the sprinkling prohibition within the City Limits of Wyoming.

This total sprinkling ban will be in effect until further notice. For more information, contact the Wyoming Water Office, (616) 530-7390 or the Wyoming Water Plant at (616) 399-6511.
