

**ORDINANCE # 09-004
PARKING ORDINANCE**

An ordinance to designate “no parking” areas for the regulation of the parking of vehicles, and to provide penalties for the violation thereof.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF JAMESTOWN, OTTAWA COUNTY, MICHIGAN,
ORDAINS:

Section 1: Title

This ordinance shall be known and cited as the Jamestown Charter Township Parking Ordinance.

Section 2: Definition

The word “parking” wherever used in this ordinance is defined to mean allowing a vehicle to remain standing for any length of time.

Section 3: Description of “no parking” areas covered by this ordinance

This ordinance pertains specifically to the following township owned lands:

- a) The east side of 24th Avenue from the road right of way at Riley Street south 180 feet.
- b) The south side of Riley Street from the 24th Avenue right of way east 57 feet.


Section 4: Regulations

No automobile, truck or other vehicle other than fire trucks, ambulances or vehicles of law enforcement agencies during the performance of their respective duties, shall be permitted to park in any “no parking” area as described in this ordinance and identified as such by signage.

When signs have been erected by any competent authority designating a “no parking” zone, the parking by any automobile, truck or other vehicle contrary thereto shall be a violation of this ordinance.

Section 5: Violation, Penalties

Any violation of this ordinance shall constitute a municipal civil infraction. Any person,



firm or corporation who violates any provision of this ordinance is responsible for a municipal civil infraction and subject to payment of a civil fine, as well as any other action by the Township to abate the violation. Increased civil fines shall be imposed for repeated offenses by the same person. Each day on which a violation of this ordinance continues shall constitute a separate offense and shall be subject to penalties or sanctions as a separate offense.

Section 5: Validity

Should any section, clause or provision of this ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

Section 6: Conflicting Provisions Repealed

Any ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.



Section 7: Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect on the 4th day of November, 2009.
