

Poverty Guidelines Resolution #R25-022

WHEREAS, the adoption of guidelines for poverty exemptions is within the purview of the township board; and

WHEREAS, the homestead of persons who, in the judgment of the supervisor and board of review, by reason of poverty, are unable to contribute to the public charges is eligible for exemption in whole or part from taxation under Public Act 390, of 1994 and further amended by PA 620 of 2002, and further amended by PA 253 of 2020 (MCL 211.7u); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to PA 390 of 1994 and further amended by PA 620 of 2002 and further amended by PA 253 of 2020, **Jamestown Charter Township**, Ottawa County adopts the following guidelines for the supervisor and board of review to implement. The guidelines shall include the specific income and asset levels of the claimant and all persons residing in the household filed in the current or immediately preceding year;

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that to be eligible for a poverty exemption in Port Sheldon Township, a person shall do all the following on an annual basis:

- 1) Be an owner of and occupy as a principal residence the property for which an exemption is requested.
- 2) File a claim with the supervisor or board of review using Michigan Department of Treasury Form 5737, Application for MCL 211.7u Poverty Exemption along with all documents required by Form 5737, including income tax returns for all persons residing in the principal residence filed in the immediately preceding year or in the current year; or a signed State Tax Commission Form 4988 Poverty Exemption Affidavit, for all persons residing in the residence who were not required to file federal or state income tax returns in the current or immediately preceding year.
- 3) Produce a valid driver's license or other form of identification, if requested.
- 4) Produce a deed, land contract, or other evidence of ownership of the property for which an exemption is requested, if required by the supervisor or board of review.
- 5) Meet the federal poverty guidelines published in the prior calendar year in the Federal Register by the United States Department of Health and Human Services under its authority to revise the poverty line under 42 USC 9902.
- 6) Meet the following **Asset Test**:

The total value of the assets of the applicant and each member of the applicant's household, combined, shall not exceed the sum of the subject property's prior year property taxes (combined summer and winter annual amount), plus 5% to account for *potential* inflation. This asset value excludes the property for which the exemption is requested and the principal vehicle for each driver, BUT includes all other property:

Property shall include, but is not limited to:

- cash
- savings
- mutual funds
- certificates of deposit
- insurance commodities
- coin collections
- boats

jewelry
art/collectibles
motor vehicles
second homes, cottages, or land elsewhere
****any other saleable real property or tangible items***

7) The application for an exemption shall be filed after January 1, but before the day prior to the last day of board of review. The filing of this claim constitutes an appearance before the board of review for the purpose of preserving the right of appeal to the Michigan Tax Tribunal.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if a person meets all eligibility requirements in statute, the board of review shall grant a full exemption equal to 100% reduction in taxable value. No partial exemptions will be considered nor granted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the board of review shall follow the above stated policy and federal guidelines in granting or denying an exemption.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that to conform to the provisions of P.A. 390 of 1994 as amended, this resolution is hereby given immediate effect and will stay in effect for subsequent years until amended or voided.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all prior resolutions of the board adopting a policy relative to the review and granting of poverty exemptions by Jamestown Charter Township are hereby repealed and rescinded.
